### 6. <u>General Governance/Constitutional Matters</u>:

#### Agreed:

- (1) The Chief Executive of the LEP would seek nominations from the smaller business community to ensure a blend of membership on the Committee. Appointments would be revisited after one year.
- (2) Informal meetings to be held at 1pm in advance of the main meeting at 2pm.
- (3) Quorum to remain at 4 but there should be one representative from each sector present (Local Authority, business and smaller business community).

Noted:

- (1) £25k would be set aside from April 2020 to enable the Committee to commission work as appropriate.

# 8. <u>Review of Progress of the Programmes that the LEP manages</u>

The Committee received a presentation from Rachel Laver on the above.

- The LEP had received £127m of Local Growth Funding (LGF).
- Funding was allocated to specific projects rather than a pot of funding allocated at the LEPs discretion.
- Three main themes were Transport, Skills and Energy.
- Schemes tended to be enabling schemes that helped open up development and create jobs and housing.
- Detailed information was provided on the allocations over the period 2015/16 to date together with key outputs and the current financial position.
