

Cheshire and Warrington Labour Market - Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning

The Cheshire and Warrington Data and Labour Market Steering Group have commissioned this work which takes the qualification pathways that have been developed by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education, mapping different occupations against them and contextualising them for the Cheshire and Warrington economy.




Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning jobs in Cheshire and Warrington²

- In 2021, there were over 7k of these jobs in Cheshire and Warrington³.
- About 2k of these jobs were at Level 3, and about 5k required qualifications at Level 4+.
- Over the next ten years, over a third of these jobs will need to be filled by new entrants because of retirements and similar.
- Town Planning Officers and Chartered Surveyors are at some risk of automation in the future.
- There are about the same number of jobs like this in Cheshire and Warrington as would be expected from the national average.

Age profile of Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning jobs

The age profile of employees in the Construction Design, Surveying & Planning pathway has a higher proportion of young people than is the case for all jobs.





Job postings⁴

- In the last five years, there have been about 6k unique job postings for this type of job in C&W (excluding staffing companies) with about 2k in Cheshire West and Chester, 1k in Cheshire East, and 3k in Warrington.
- These jobs were mainly advertised in Warrington (2,905); Chester (701); Northwich (686); Crewe (360); Macclesfield (180); Knutsford (156); Ellesmere Port (148); and Wilmslow (94).
- The average number of times a role likes this gets advertised in Cheshire and Warrington has increased from 3 in 2016 to 4 in 2021. This may indicate that employers are finding these roles slightly harder to fill recently.
- Top recruiters in Cheshire and Warrington (excluding staffing agencies) include Atkins;
 Arcadis; AECOM; Jacobs; United Utilities; Kingsley; Galliford Try Plc; Millbank Holdings; and
 Navartis Limited.
- The most frequently advertised job titles in Cheshire and Warrington are for Quantity Surveyors; Surveyors; Estimators; Project Quantity Surveyors; Building Surveyors; Architectural Technicians; Structural Engineers; Geotechnical Engineers; Site Engineers; and Highway Engineers.



Apprenticeships

In the past five years, there have been 214 apprenticeships advertised in Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning occupations in Cheshire and Warrington. These opportunities have been thinly spread aside from a concentration of just less than 40 in Warrington.

In the academic year 2019/20, 60 residents of Cheshire and Warrington started an apprenticeship in a Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning occupation. 90% of these apprenticeships were Level 4+. Chartered Surveyor was the apprenticeship standard with the most starts.

College Courses

The most popular course with young people in Cheshire and Warrington in the 2019/20 academic year that fed into Construction - Design, Surveying & Planning occupations was the BTEC Extended Diploma in Construction and the Built Environment. The T-level in design, surveying and planning for construction is being rolled out now. This is intended to replace other Level 3 vocational qualifications.
